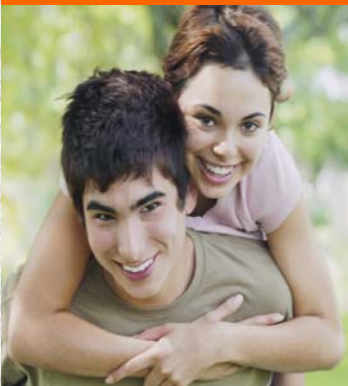

TAYA has expanded greatly over the past year and has become a staple in the local community by providing quality reproductive and sexual healthcare to an “at-risk” population. Patient visits have increased steadily with over 6,400 visits in FY’08-09, with the number of visits increasing each successive quarter. Not only has there been an increase in number of patient visits but also the number of patients served during outreach activities.

We are also proud to announce that we opened a satellite site in Gaithersburg, MD to accommodate the growing demand for our services up-county.

TAYA continues to work closely with the Montgomery County, Prince George’s County and DC school systems, as well as other nonprofit providers, to ensure our client base receives vital health care services that they might not otherwise be aware of, or able to afford.

TAYA will continue to add health care professionals to expand services as well as the number of patient visits, while consistently striving to achieve the highest degree of patient care in the community. 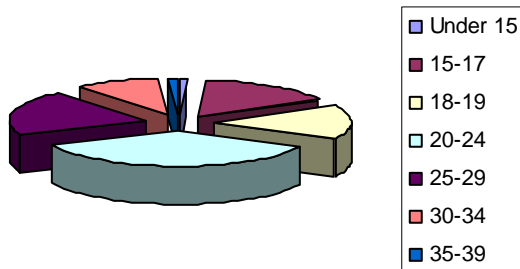

Highlights and Achievements

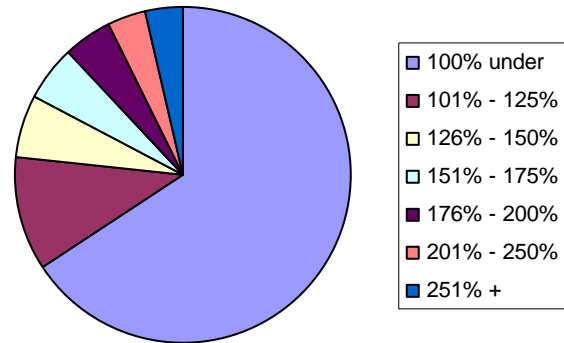
- 7,295 patients served at the clinic and during health fairs, outreach and educational activities during the fiscal year 2008-2009.
